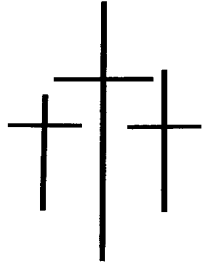

It took getting me out of my comfort zone for me to mature and develop the work ethic my parents tried to instill in me.

As we look to train the next generation of leaders within the church, I pray that getting these youth out of their comfort zone will help them to mature and grow in their desire to work within God's Kingdom and serve others. ORLC has a dynamic history. Our prayer is for a dynamic future as well.
