To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

I started writing this letter on May 20. All that I had written was "I am so excited that June is here." I wrote those words in anticipation of our Summer activities – VBS, vacations, youth trips, swimming, bike riding, etc. On May 23, Annalisa broke her left arm above the elbow. The doctor said she will be in a cast for six to eight weeks. We would be leaving for Montana seven weeks to the day of when she got her cast.

I suppose this is why James the brother of our Lord instructed us saying, "Come now, you who say, 'Today or tomorrow we will go into such and such a town and spend a year there and trade and make a profit.' – yet you do not know what tomorrow will bring. . . Instead you ought to say, 'If the Lord wills, we will live and do this or that'" [James 5:13-15].

It is amazing how quickly our plans can change. We all have plans for our life, but the reality is that God has *the* plan for our life. As we were sitting in the emergency room, we were all very upset, fearful, hopeful, and running the gamut of emotions. Our first concern was for Annalisa's health. Thankfully, our prayers were answered and no surgery was needed. However, she has a nice crack in her humerus bone. Of course, the obvious comment was made that there was nothing "humerus" about this situation.

As much as Malinda and I would love to turn back time, give our usual cautiously overprotective advice, and not allow her to have her two wheeled skateboard called a "Ripstik", we must live in the reality that God has a purpose for this. I would like to think that from this point forward there would be a little less eye rolling from my daughters when we ask them not to engage in mildly dangerous activity. When they ask why they can't do certain things that their friends are doing, I will simply give a one word response, "Ripstik."

Throughout our lives, we are confronted with trials and difficulties far worse than a broken arm – life threatening illnesses, the death of a loved one, the loss of a job, persecution for our faith, and the list goes on and on. Pondering this, again we turn to James who wrote, "Count it all joy, my brothers, when you meet trials of various kinds, for you know that the testing of your faith produces steadfastness. And let steadfastness have its full effect, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing" [James 1:2-4].

What this means is that, through our trials and difficulties, we grow stronger. As a parent, as much as I would like to wrap my children in bubble-wrap to keep them from any harm, they could never grow and mature. Our Father in heaven deals with us the same way. He doesn't wrap us in bubble-wrap either. We do experience harm in this sinful world. However, through these trials, we grow and mature in our faith and life. And having gone through the trials of life, we have those constant reminders to stay away from dangerous activity. It is God's way of saying "Ripstik" when we stray away from our life of faith – the ultimate dangerous activity.

Although certain Summer plans have changed for our family, I am still excited as we enter the month of June. There is so much for which to be joyful. Besides, James says we are to "count it all joy" no matter what today or tomorrow brings. God has *the* plan, and He has assured us that *the* plan involves the resurrection of the body and life everlasting.
