Scrip Cards! Get your Scrip Cards here! What is Scrip? Scrip is like "substitute money". When you purchase scrip, you are purchasing gift certificates and prepaid cards that are used just like cash. You can use scrip to purchase everyday expenses like food, clothing, and other essentials, and with every purchase, you earn revenue for our organization. The average return is 5%. So far we have a profit of **\$1,438.32!!** With that profit, we have been able to purchase additional cards to have on hand for immediate resale!
